### Research Advisory Committee Meeting

The NRCS Research Advisory Committee met on 28-29 February under the Chairmanship of Prof AS Khehra, Former VC, Punjab Agril. University. Other distinguished members present were: Drs. KA Kulkarni (UAS, Dharwad), PD



Tyagi (New Delhi), Dashwant Reddy (OU, Hyderabad), N Seetharama, Director, NRCS, BU Singh, Member Secretary and Non-official members Mrs. Pushpagiri Goswami (New Delhi) and Sh. P. Janardhan Reddy (Ex-MLA-Hyd.). However, Drs. GS Sharma (RAU, Udaipur), RL Yadav (Director, IISR, Lucknow) and SN Shukla (ADG-FFC), ICAR) were unable to attend.

The director appraised the committee on the



reorientation of the projects under five main research areas. The Research Area Leaders (RALs) presented their overviews and objectives of each of the projects. All Scientists participated in the deliberations. The members reviewed the progress made by each scientist and suggested various measures to improve the standards of research and data analysis.

# Sorghum stall at Kisan Mela, Pusa, New Delhi

A sorghum stall was put up in the Kisan Mela organized in the IARI Campus, New Delhi during 27 & 28 February. Hon'ble Union Agriculture Minister Shri Rajnath Singh inaugurated the Mela and Dr. Mangala Rai, DG-ICAR and Secretary DARE addressed the farmers. Farmers in particular were interested in fodder variety SSG 59-3, sweet sorghum variety SSV 84 and dual purpose variety CSV 15. Sorghum products namely beer, jaggery, alcohol, bread, cake, etc., drew special interest from the visitors. Pamphlets and technical bulletins in English and Hindi were distributed to about 10,000 farmers, scientists, agricultural officers, students, etc., who visited our stall, and the latest production technology techniques queries were answered by Dr. B Subbarayudu, Sh. Pramod Kumar and Sh. Vijav Kumar. Our stall ranked in "excellent category" for display.

### Visit of Afghani delegation

A team of 15 delegates from Ministry of Agriculture, Government of Afghanistan visited



NRCS as a part of their study on Indian Seed Industry. They were apprised of the various activities and research programmes of this national Centre, Drs. # National-level training course on kharif & rabi sorghum varieties and production technology

The Centre for Excellence on Training (CET) for Sorghum at NRCS conducted an 8-day national



level training course on "Kharif and rabi sorghum varieties and production technology" from 18-25 February. This programme was sponsored by Directorate of Extension, MOA, GOI. Nineteen senior level agricultural officers, from Maharashtra, Gujarat, Karnataka, Tamil Nadu and AP attended this programme. A total of 21 lectures were delivered on diverse topics related to sorghum technologies, Intellectual Property Rights and Internet Technologies. Trainees visited all labs and fields at NRCS. CRIDA and ICRISAT as a part of their training programme. They also visited the ARS, Tandur and interacted with the local sorghum farmers. Dr. RK Samanta, Director in-charge, NAARM was the chief guest for the valedictory session

and distributed the certificates. We congratulate Dr. Ch. Sashidhar Reddy and his team for making this training programmes a great success.

### Rabi sorghum field day at CRS Solapur

Centre on Rabi Sorghum (NRCS), Solapur Field Day was organized in Maharashtra, on 3 February. The programme was inaugurated by Dr. Ajit Deshpande, Soil Scientist, ZARS, Solapur. About 250 farmers from north and south regions of Solapur district actively participated. They visited the research farm, demonstration plots and museum and disseminated with the information on rabi sorghum production technology, already released and new hybrids and varieties in the pipeline. Presentations were made in Hindi, Marathi and Kannada.

During the question and answer session, most of the queries rallied around grain yield potential and nutritional aspects of sorghum varieties. Farmers showed more interest on by-products of sorghum. Dr. MD Shinde, Sr. Breeder & Officer In-charge, ARS, Mohol (MPKV), Dr. BD Biradar, Sr. Breeder, ARS, Bijapur (UAS) and many scientists from ZARS, Solapur also keenly participated and guided the farmers.

### Visit of CARI scientist, Port Blair

Dr. TVRS Sharma, Head, Division of Field Crops, Central Agricultural Research Institute, Port Blair, Andaman & Nikobar Islands, visited NRCS on 11 February to discuss our plan to screen photosensitive sorghums for resistance to both grain mold and leaf diseases. Such sorghums do not flower in mainland and therefore Port Blair which is close to the equator is used.
